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2021 Women in Aviation Workforce Report:

A Call to Action

he 2021 Women in Aviation Workforce Report was recently published and provides data to support that women remain significantly underrepresented in most fields in aviation. What is clear is that little progress is being made in significantly increasing the representation of women in aviation. As an addition to the report this year, data on underrepresented groups based on race/ethnicity were included when available.

Women make up less than 20% of most aviation occupations and the areas with the largest gender gaps continue to be pilots (5%), maintenance technicians (2.6%), and senior leadership positions (3%). A primary concern is the lack of significant change in the representation of women in aviation over time. The result is a flatline effect. While it is encouraging that the total number of women certificate holders have increased over the last 60 years, the representation of women as a percentage of the total has experienced only minor change. Over a span of 60 years, the percentage of female commercial pilots has changed at a rate of about 1% a decade and mechanics have increased at about half that rate. Additionally, it should be noted that female student pilots are not converting at high rates to private pilots. Age demographics show that the number of female active pilots begins to decline after age 29, while men remain active pilots at a more consistent rate as they age.

Numerous studies have revealed key factors that contribute to the underrepresentation of women in aviation include:

- Negative workplace culture to include implicit bias, discrimination, and sexual harassment
- Challenging work/life/family balance
- Lack of women in leadership positions
- Need for leadership commitment to diversity and inclusion
- Need for increased youth outreach

women in aviation. The evidence is strong and overwhelming; to effect any real change in the representation and advancement of women in aviation requires culture change. Increasing the number of women in senior leadership positions is key to addressing culture change and enhancing the numbers of women in aviation.

Work/life/family balance challenges are a significant barrier that disproportionality affects women in aviation.

Continued outreach is essential to attract members of underrepresented groups to aviation. Evidence shows that outreach should start at an early age with 10 and younger being a key targeted age group. Examples of excellent programs targeted at underrepresented groups include Women in Aviation International's Girls in Aviation Day and the Organization of Black Aerospace Professionals' Girls Launch program.

The report also shows the underrepresentation of racial/ethnically diverse groups in aviation. For example, airline/commercial pilots are 94% white, 3.4% Black or African American, 2.2% Asian, and 5% Hispanic or Latino. There continues to be insufficient data overall, particularly gender data disaggregated by race/ethnicity. What gets measured gets done.

The result of the study is a call to action. Creating a diverse aviation workforce is essential for enhanced safety, increased innovation, greater profitability, and meeting the workforce demand of the aviation industry. Occupation areas that urgently require additional emphasis include pilots, maintenance technicians, aerospace engineers, dispatchers, airport managers, air traffic controllers, and a continued focus on the need for women in aviation leadership positions. For the industry to gain the benefits of broad representation in the aviation workforce and meet the workforce needs of the future, we simply must address the identified barriers and create the change.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Air and Marine Opera-

tions (AMO), will be attending WAI2022. Within the largest law enforcement agency in the country, AMO provides the eyes in the sky and the interceptor vessels on



the water to interdict inbound threats to the U.S. and investigate dangerous criminal networks. AMO currently has 569 Air Interdiction Agents, who pilot airplanes, helicopters, and unmanned aircraft systems. They conduct airborne surveillance to detect and support the interdiction of the unlawful movement of people, narcotics, and vehicles across the U.S. border. Other duties include supporting search and rescue activities and conducting security missions for events designated as National Special Security Events, such as the State of the Union, the Superbowl, Presidential inaugurations, and Democratic/Republican National Conventions.

AMO has three agent recruiters and one human resource specialist at booth 746 to discuss our mission, hiring process, or share their own experiences working for AMO.
