<u>Secretary of Transportation Elaine Chao</u> and will sit for approximately two years.

"WAI shares the objective of the Advisory Board, and has been actively encouraging more women and girls to consider careers in aviation for over 30 years. #### WAI Remembers the Pioneering WASP on Memorial Day Weekend

With social distancing in mind, WAI chapters creatively and safely visited the gravesites of more than 100 Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) in honor of Memorial Day 2020. Inducted into WAI's International Pioneer Hall of Fame in 1993, the WASP flew for the U.S. Army Airforce from September 1942 to December 1944 during World War II. Some 1,102 women wore the silver wings flying more than 70 million miles and delivering 12,650 aircraft across the country during their time of operation. Today there are 31 WASP still living.

Thank you to WAI members and friends that provided updates for our <u>WASP database</u> to find their final resting places across the nation. WAI appreciates the continued partnership of <u>Texas Woman's University</u> (home of the WASP archives).


