We've Got 100 Scholarships!

The 2022 WAI scholarship program is live and taking applications. Members are encouraged to visit www.WAI.org/scholarships and review dozens of scholarships that fit your aviation and aerospace interests.

Currently there are 100 scholarships totaling \$485,505 offered for flight training, engineering, maintenance, dispatcher, drones, and professional development for individuals in all stages of life.

Applicants are encouraged to check for new scholarships often and may apply for up to three scholarships per year. In order to qualify for a scholarship, the applicant must be a WAI member as of October 1, 2021. The deadline for 2022 applications is Tuesday, October 12, 2021.

In 2021, WAI awarded 149 scholarships valued at \$731,805. This total includes 47 scholarships awarded through a \$250,000 Conrad N. Hilton Foundation grant. The total amount of scholarships awarded by WAI since 1995 is more than \$14.5 million.

#OSH21 Shines with Connect Breakfast and Busy WAI Booth

Enjoying the return to a major in-person aviation event--EAA Air Venture Oshkosh 2021--Women in Aviation International kicked off WomenVenture 2021 last week with more than 200 attendees at the 13th WAI Connect Breakfast, co-sponsored by Avemco and United Airlines. Held at the Paul H. Poberezny Conference Center (PHP Tent), the breakfast featured two female members of the Orbis MD-10 Flying Eye Hospital, pilot Cyndhi Berwyn and mechanic Valerie Sudberg, who shared their stories about volunteering for the global effort to end

avoidable blindness in this state-of-the-art flying teaching hospital. WAI members and guests were invited to tour the aircraft during #OSH21 and learn more about this important humanitarian program.

In past years, the group would have migrated from the breakfast to Boeing Plaza for the annual WomenVenture group photo. In 2019, the last time the group photo was taken, more than a thousand women photo was taken in person. Rather, WomenVenture participants were encouraged to take a selfie in the annual WomenVenture t-shirt and submit it to receive a free WomenVenture 2021 framed digital version of their photo. Photos submitted will also be used to create a commemorative photo collage that is available for download here (or after AirVenture 2021).

"WAI was delighted to meet with hundreds of new and existing individual and corporate members during EAA AirVenture last week," WAI CEO Allison McKay says. "We were able to share important information about our WAI 2022 scholarships, now totaling 100 valued at more than \$485,000 in awards, as well as Girls in Aviation Day on September 25, 2021, and our 33rd Annual International Women in Aviation Conference March 17-19, 2022, in Nashville, Tennessee."

In addition, WAI staff welcomed hundreds of members at its booth Hangar B-2041 during the week-long event with special visits from WAI members Jessica Cox, the first licensed armless pilot; Olga Custodio, the first female Latina U.S. military pilot as well as the first Latina commercial pilot at American Airlines; Tammie Jo Shults, one of the first female fighter pilots to serve in the U.S. Navy and captain of Southwest 1380 flight; Gen. Jacqueline Van Ovost, a four-star general recently nominated as commander at the U.S. Transportation Command and now serving as commander of Air Mobility Command, Patty Wagstaff, a six-time member of the U.S. Aerobatic Team and the first woman to win the title of U.S. National Aerobatic champion; Shaesta Waiz, the youngest woman to fly solo around the world in a singleengine aircraft; and many others.

Wally Funk, Lifetime member 26, fulfilled her lifelong mission to become an astronaut on July 20, 2021, during New Shepard's first human flight. At age 82, Wally became the oldest person to fly in space and joined Jeff and Mark Bezos, the first siblings to ever fly in space together, and Oliver Daemen, the youngest person to fly in space at age 18.

WAI members and friends around the world, watched Wally and her three colleagues during their approximately 10minute flight to space.

Wally is the first female FAA inspector and first female NTSB air safety investigator, and was inducted into the <u>WAI</u> <u>Pioneer Hall of Fame in 1995</u>. The city of Grapevine, Texas, will welcome Wally home this Saturday, August 7 at noon <u>during a parade along Grapevine's Historic Main Street</u>.
