After graduating college, she received a commission in the US Army and became an AH-64D Apache pilot. During her time in the Army, she had the opportunity to serve as a Company Commander, and fly around the world including assignments in South Korea and Germany as well as a combat deployment in Afghanistan.

After completing ten years in the Army, Morgan went in search of her next path. She spent five months traveling around the United States, visiting the National Parks, and selling her artwork. She realized in this time how much she missed flying, and found a flight school in Idaho where she received my helicopter CFI/CFII

Shortly after, Morgan moved to Louisiana where she flew helicopters offshore in the Gulf of Mexico working in oil and gas. It was during this time a close friend and former military peer informed her that there was a program for helicopter pilots to transition to the airlines. Her responsibilities include ensuring all work is accomplished safely and efficiently, by supporting her technicians in technical, administrative, and personal matters, as well as, coordinating the work of facility and ground support equipment repair vendors.

Prior to her role as Supervisor, Laura held the position of Aviation Maintenance Technician (AMT), working on

multiple aircraft types. Though with United a total of 16 years, she has been a certified Airframe and Powerplant technician for more than 26 years, spending most of that time in the Line Maintenance (airport) environment.

The team competed in the 2018 & 2019 Aerospace Maintenance Competition (AMC), making history in 2018 by being the first all-female team to compete commercially. The Chix Fix team will compete again in 2020.



Lieutenant Commander Danielle Varwig is originally from New York City and studied mechanical engineering at Penn State University. While at Penn State, she attended Air Force ROTC and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 2006. She went through pilot training at Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas and was selected to fly the C-17 out of Travis Air Force Base, California from 2009-2013. In 2012, she volunteered to fly the MC-12W (ISR type aircraft) based out of Kandahar for 7 1/2 months in support of the Global War on Terrorism. From 2013 - 2017, Danielle was a T-6 flight instructor at Columbus Air Force Base, Mississippi. Her last duty station while in the Air Force was at Naval Air Station Pensacola instructing combat system officer training, also in the T-6. Danielle joined the NOAA Commissioned Officer Corps through an interservice transfer, commissioning as a NOAA Corps Lieutenant Commander on February 11, 2020. She is stationed at the NOAA Aircraft Operations Center in Lakeland, FL and

is in the training pipeline to become a Hurricane Hunter flying NOAA's Gulfstream IV-SP. Danielle, her husband, two children, and dog are enjoying living in the Tampa Bay area.



**Captain Kristin "Beo" Wolfe** is the Commander, F-35A Lightning II Demonstration Team, 388<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing, Hill Air Force Base, Utah.
