# Wisconsin Plans Vaccine Distribution to Essential Workers, As CDC Considers Scope of Group

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has released an executive summary detailing the state's three-phase plan to distribute COVID-19 vaccinations, noting that "limited COVID-19 vaccine doses may be available in late 2020 with supply expected to increase substantially through 2021."

Phase One vaccine recipients are likely to include:

- Healthcare personnel exposed to or treating people with COVID-19
- People living in long-term care or assisted living facilities and people 65 years of age or older
- Other essential workers, based upon definitions recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and Wisconsin's State Disaster Medical Advisory Committee (SDMAC)

The <u>ACIP is meeting</u> tomorrow to discuss modeling for the initial allocation of vaccines. Neither ACIP nor SDMAC has yet announced the scope of the Phase One "essential workers" group.

# **CFAP Round 2 Payments Now Total \$7.6 Billion**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture this week reports it has <u>distributed \$7.6 billion</u> in direct relief payments to farmers via the second round of its Coronavirus Food Assistance Program, including \$790 million to dairy farmers.

## Wisconsin Supreme Court Schedules Hearing on Mask Mandate Lawsuit

The Wisconsin Supreme Court will hear a lawsuit challenging the emergency powers Gov. Tony Evers used to issue a statewide mask mandate. Oral arguments are scheduled for November 16, five days before the current order is set to expire.
