House Committee Continues DBI Funding at Reduced Level



The House Appropriations Committee last week released its Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 proposal for U.S. Department of Agriculture funding. The bill includes just \$8 million for Dairy Business Innovation (DBI) Initiatives a 37 percent decrease from the House proposal of \$11 million in FY25. This means each of the four DBI centers nationwide, including the one run by Center for Dairy Research and WCMA, would receive approximately \$2 million. WCMA is working with Senators to try to increase final appropriations from the House proposal.

Wisconsin Legislators Support WCMA Budget Priorities

As Wisconsin's budget-writing Joint Finance Committee prepares to vote on state funding

- An annual funding increase for WIAE from \$1 million to \$2 million, with the program and funding level made permanent in the base budget.
- An annual funding increase from \$200,000 to \$1.2 million for Wisconsin Dairy Processor Grants.

Senate Committee Passes Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act



The Senate Agriculture Committee last week <u>passed the Whole Milk for Healthy</u> <u>Kids Act</u>, a bipartisan proposal to allow schools to offer both whole and 2 percent milk to students through nutrition programs. The bill was approved by the House in December 2023, but failed to receive consideration on the Senate floor. The current effort is led by Sens. Roger Marshall (R-KS) and Peter Welch (D-VT) <u>in the</u> <u>Senate</u>, and by Reps. Glenn "GT" Thompson (R-PA) and Angie Craig (D-MN) <u>in the House</u>. <u>READ MORE...</u>
