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ADVOCACY

Thanks go to the members of WCMA's Policy Committee for their engagement, and to the many members who have joined in campaigns to educate and lobby our elected leaders.



AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL...



COVID-19 EFFORTS

WCMA has partnered with other leading dairy organizations to secure direct farmer aid and USDA purchases of dairy products, and we're advocating for:

- \$1 billion in block grants to state departments of agriculture

WCMA pushed for passage of the <u>U.S.-Mexico-</u> Canada trade agreement, and looks forward to its implementation in the months to come.

WCMA also partnered with U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin on the Dairy Business Innovation Initiative, a program which will deliver \$20 million each year, for the next four years to projects boosting specialty cheesemaking, dairy exports, and on-farm diversification.

Together with the Center for Dairy Research, WCMA was selected by USDA to administer DBII monies in direct-to-business grants, beginning in June 2020. Learn more at WisCheeseMakers.org

IN WISCONSIN...

WCMA has delivered big wins at the state level over the past 12 months, including:

- \$<u>25.7 million in project support</u> for the Center for Dairy Research building
- \$9 million for the new <u>Dairy Innovation Hub</u>

- \$3 million in rural capital access
 Regulatory reform of <u>rBST affidavits</u>
 Creation of a water quality <u>credit clearinghouse</u>

WCMA has also secured support from the Evers Administration and many legislative leaders for truth-in-dairy labeling legislation, export aids, and increased funding for dairy processor grants.







COVID-19 EFFORTS

WCMA is working in collaboration with state leaders through the coronavirus pandemic, securing:

- \$50 million in direct aid for farmers
- \$15 million in food buying programs, designed to support the dairy industry and those facing food insecurity
- Regulatory flexibility on milk disposal and license renewals
- · Face masks for members

WCMA SCHOLARSHIPS

WCMA's student scholarships are an important part of the Association's investment in the industry's future leaders. In 2020, WCMA awarded \$15,000 in scholarships to member employees pursuing higher education. Watch for the 2021 application form coming this fall!

WCMA CONTRIBUTES TO UW-RIVER FALLS PROJECT

In October 2019, the WCMA Board of Directors <u>pledged an additional gift of \$50,000</u> to the University of Wisconsin-River Falls Dairy Pilot Plant, bringing the Association's total donation to \$250,000.

CDR PROJECT FUNDING APPROVED

In February, Governor Tony Evers and the Wisconsin State Building Commission members unanimously approved a \$25.7 million boost in overall project funding for the Center for Dairy Research and Babcock Dairy Hall building project, with support coming from UW-Madison, additional borrowing, and industry gifts.
