Evers Extends Safer at Home Order through Memorial Day, Wisconsin Schools Closed

Moments ago, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers announced an extension of the state's safer at home orders until 8 a.m. on Tuesday, May 26. Evers is also ordering schools closed for the remainder of the school year. Read the full order here.

The order also notes the continued importance of essential and critical businesses, including dairy manufacturing and processing. Essential and critical businesses are directed by the order to increase cleaning and disinfection practices, and adopt policies to prevent workers exposed to COVID-19 or those displaying symptoms from coming to work.

As a reminder, members of the Dairy Food Safety Alliance, led by the Center for Dairy Research, Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin, and Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association, have developed a <u>template standard operating procedure</u> (updated on April 14), in the event of a COVID-19 positive employee in your plant, as well as <u>employer guidance</u>.

Sargento Foods Donates \$2 Million in Cheese to Help Food Banks Across Country

WCMA member Sargento Foods this morning announced it is donating \$2 million in cheese to Hunger Task Force and Feeding America, to aid food-insecure families in Wisconsin and across the country. CEO Louie Gentine noted in a release on the gift, "We are honored to be a vital part of our nation's food supply and will do everything we can to make sure families have food on the table and to support our community in a real way."

SBA Coronavirus Relief Funds Depleted

This morning, Small Business Administration officials announced they are now "unable to accept new applications for the Paycheck Protection Program," as they have run out of the funding approved by Congress less than two weeks ago.

Congress is <u>negotiating the terms of a fourth relief package</u> with an expansion and extension of PPP and other relief lending on the table.

MI, PA, WI Governors Call for State Stabilization Aid

Governors from Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin today sent a letter to President Donald Trump, calling for \$500 billion in nationwide aid to stabilize states. The letter notes Wisconsin's unemployment rate has hit 15 percent, and that the state is on track to lose \$2 billion in revenue over the next year.

Evers Signs Coronavirus Response Bill

Just hours after Senate passage, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers yesterday signed the <u>state's coronavirus response bill</u> into law. The bill enables Wisconsin to access federal monies designed to maximize unemployment benefits and business aids. WCMA advocated for these elements of the bill, as well as a lift of the state's one-week waiting period for unemployment benefits, which was also included.

Trade Group: 30% of WI Restaurants Won't Survive

Leaders from the Wisconsin Restaurant Association (WRA) yesterday estimated that 30 percent of the state's restaurants will not survive the economic strain of the coronavirus pandemic. The trade group believes another 30 percent are in jeopardy.
