# Midwest Governors Announce Bipartisan Partnership to Reopen Regional Economy

Together with the governors of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, and Ohio, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers last night announced <u>a regional partnership to reopen the economies of Midwestern states</u>.

Together, the bipartisan group of leaders noted their top priority is the health and safety of citizens, saying "We will make decisions based on facts, science, and recommendations from experts in health care, business, labor, and education."

They listed four factors which will determine when to reopen the Midwest's economy:

- Sustained control of the rate of new infections and hospitalizations
- Enhanced ability to test and trace
- Sufficient health care capacity to handle resurgence
- Best practices for social distancing in the workplace

The state leaders also noted that their new partnership "doesn't mean our economy will reopen all at once, or that every state will take the same steps at the same time. But close coordination will ensure we get this right."

Earlier in the day, Evers had <u>extended Wisconsin's safer at home order</u> to 8 a.m. on Tuesday, May 26. Here's a look at reactions via recent news coverage:

## Perdue: USDA Will Not Reopen DMC, Expects to Make Up to \$3 Billion in Purchases

Promising to release details of an agricultural aid package soon, USDA Secretary Sonny Perdue yesterday stated the <u>agency would not reopen the Dairy Margin Coverage</u> program, despite urging from farm groups and some lawmakers.

Perdue noted that the first draft of USDA's package totals \$16-\$18 billion in funding, with direct payments to farmers accounting for the bulk of programming. He said, "We're also going to have about a \$2 to \$3 billion dollar purchasing program trying to take this dislocated food out of our supply chain that had been going into food service institutions and move it back into our food banks and other non-profits to rake in again to help provide the needed food for people who are staying at home."

WCMA continues to lobby lawmakers and agency officials on this issue, and will keep members informed of developments.


