#### Register Now for Tomorrow's USDA Webinar Outlining Relief Program, Purchasing Power

U.S. Department of Agriculture officials will host a<u>webinar</u> tomorrow (Tuesday, April 21) at 1 p.m. (CT) to detail the purchasing portion of its <u>Coronavirus Food</u> <u>Assistance Program (CFAP)</u>, announced late last Friday. You must<u>register now to</u> <u>participate</u>.

Along with \$16 billion in direct aid to farmers and ranchers, CFAP provides:

- \$3 billion in food purchases destined for food banks, community and faithbased organizations, and other non-profits serving Americans in need, including \$100 million per month in dairy product purchases;
- \$873.3 million in Section 32 funding for purchases of agricultural products for food banks; and
- \$850 million in funding for food banks, \$600 million of which is designated for food purchases.

USDA officials plan to begin accepting proposals for product purchases in the next two weeks. If you are not already an approved Agricultural Marketing Services (AMS) vendor, and wish to be considered, <u>please apply today</u>; the process itself can take two to three weeks.

#### Alert State Officials Now to CFAP Interest

USDA Secretary Sonny Perdue has invited state officials to share lists of businesses interested in participating in CFAP's purchasing program.

Wisconsin-based businesses with an interest in USDA consideration should email <u>Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection staff</u>by

tomorrow (Tuesday, April 21) at 12 noon sharing your:

- facility location(s),
- type(s) of product,
- primary contact and associated contact information.

## **USDA Solicits Process Cheese for FFCRA**

USDA officials today issued a <u>solicitation for process cheese</u> bids as fulfillment of part of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA). Bids are due on next Monday, with determinations announced on April 30. Deliveries of product will be expected in June 2020. Questions may be directed to <u>USDA procurement staff</u>.

#### **Evers Announces Plan to Reopen Wisconsin**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today announced <u>Emergency Order 31: Badger</u> <u>Bounce Back</u>, a plan to evaluate Wisconsin's readiness and, ultimately, to reopen the state's economy. The Badger Bounce Back <u>plan-in-brief is available here</u>; a more <u>detailed version is available here</u>.

The plan notes Wisconsin officials must continue to increase lab capacity and testing, track the spread of COVID-19, increase health care capacity, and procure more personal protective equipment. The state will also continue to track gating criteria, a downward trajectory of influenza-like and COVID-like illnesses reported, as well as positive cases in a 14-day period.

The plan also calls on employers to implement physical distancing and protective equipment, as possible, temperature checks and symptom screening, sanitation and disinfection practices, limited travel, and other best practices as advised by federal, state, and local regulators.

Evers outlined three phases of reopening, beyond the Safer at Home order. In Phase One, restaurants and retail shops will reopen, with the implementation of safety protocols. In Phase Two, Wisconsin would see bars, non-essential businesses, and some post-secondary educational institutions reopen. Finally, Phase Three would eliminate online and distance education directives for K-12 schools and daycares.

#### WCMA Advocates for Industry PPE Access

WCMA today sent a letter to Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers, asking that he grant the dairy processing industry priority access to personal protective equipment, once the needs of the medical community have been met. Many members have expressed interest, in particular, in disposable face masks for their staff, noting great challenges in obtaining them through traditional venues.
