As often news and needs warrant, Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association will distribute special bulletins alerting you to information and resources related to industry operations and coronavirus (COVID-19). Your WCMA staff is here to support you, and we thank you for your important work.

### U.S. Senate Approves \$450B Relief Package

As expected, on Tuesday, the <u>U.S. Senate approved a \$484 billion coronavirus relief</u> <u>package</u>, including an additional \$310 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), including \$60 billion for community banks and smaller lenders, as well as \$75 billion for hospitals, \$25 billion for testing, and \$60 billion for emergency disaster loans and grants.

The U.S. House is set for a vote on the package as early as tomorrow.

WCMA members who have not yet secured PPP support are encouraged to talk with a SBA-approved lender immediately to ensure readiness for application.

# WDNR Suspends Need for Wastewater Operator Continuing Education; License Renewal

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, working with the Governor's office, has announced useful information regarding continuing education and expiration of licenses, including the certified wastewater operator license.

<u>Emergency Order 30</u>, signed by Governor Tony Evers, suspends requirements to gather continuing education credits and suspends the expiration of licenses during Wisconsin's public health emergency (ending May 11, 2020 as ordered in <u>Executive Order 72</u>).

WDNR is "working to determine a period of time" after May 11 that operators will have to obtain continuing education credits. Based on conversations with WDNR staff, the agency is inclined to push requirements for continuing education credits far enough into the future to allow essential licensed operators to perform their work

during this pandemic without the distraction of finding coursework.
