USDA Increases Monthly SNAP Benefits by 40%

USDA announced today it is <u>increasing funding for Supplemental Nutrition</u>
<u>Assistance Program (SNAP)</u> households by \$2 billion per month. These emergency benefits represent a 40 percent increase in overall monthly SNAP benefits, and would provide the average five-person household an additional \$240 monthly in food purchasing power.

Tools to Become a USDA Food Vendor

WCMA members with interest in bidding on USDA solicitations must first become an approved vendor, a process which can take a few weeks. There are many tools to support your application, including the <u>step-by-step webinar</u> linked below.

In recent days, USDA has offered three solicitations for truckload quantities of process cheese, butter and cheddar cheese shreds, and butter and cheddar cheese. The agency is tapping trade mitigation funds, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act and its long-standing Section 32 funds for these new dairy buys.

SBA Issues New PPP Guidance to Limit Large Companies' Access

The Small Business Administration (SBA) issued new guidance today, making it less likely that large, publicly traded companies will be able to access new funding via the Paycheck Protection Program. Borrowers must certify that loan support is necessary.

The guidance comes just as Congress prepares to approve a \$310 billion boost to the program, after its initial \$350 billion was used up in less than two weeks. Lenders expect fresh funds to be expended in days.

SBA officials noted that large public companies which accessed PPP funds prior to today's guidance publication can avoid their scrutiny by <u>returning relief loans</u> within two weeks.
