Wisconsin Launches Free Online Screening Tool

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has launched a free, online coronavirus screening tool, called Wisconsin Health Connect. A self-screening can be completed in ten minutes via a smartphone or computer and, following completion, a nurse will call you within one hour to review results. All information is kept private in accordance with HIPAA standards. The service is available at no charge 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

FEMA Issues Guidance on Non-Hospital Use of PPE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency has issued <u>guidance on the proper</u> <u>use and management of personal protective equipment (PPE)</u> by essential, critical (but non-medical) workers.

WCMA Joins IDFA to Advocate for Recourse Loans

WCMA has joined with the International Dairy Foods Association to advocate for a new recourse loan program at the U.S. Department of Agriculture, designed to expand availability of working capital for dairy processors during the coronavirus pandemic. The program should last two years to ensure it can get processors through the crisis, and loan amounts should cover extended terms of up to 120 days on a rolling basis.
