WHO Reiterates Safety of Food Chain, Packaging

The World Health Organization (WHO) has reaffirmed the safety of the global food chain, saying it has found no evidence of coronavirus spreading via food or packaging.

WHO Head of Emergencies Program Mike Ryan noted at a briefing in Geneva Thursday, "There is no evidence that food or the food chain is participating in transmission of this virus. And people should feel comfortable and safe."

Ryan's statement came in response to questions regarding a report from Chinese officials, that traces of coronavirus had been found in frozen chicken wings from Brazil and on the packaging of frozen shrimp from Ecuador.

USDA Again Amends Food Box Solicitation

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has made an<u>additional amendment</u> to its third round of solicitations for the Farmers to Families Food Box program. The amendment notes state level GAP certification programs as signs of contract quality.

Complete details on the Farmers to Families Food Box program, which continues to accept bids for combination food boxes and dairy food boxes on a rolling basis, is <u>available online</u>.

Wisconsin Launches COVID-19 Response and Recovery Investment Dashboard

On Friday, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers launched the <u>COVID-19 Response and</u> <u>Recovery Investment Dashboard</u>, a site designed to provide transparent, updated information on how and where the state is directing federal funding, including monies from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The site provides a breakdown of funding by program and by county.

Evers has approximately <u>\$300 million more in CARES funding</u> to spend on COVID-19 relief efforts between now and the end of the year.
