FDA & OSHA Share Checklist for Food Processors

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) today released a checklist for all food manufacturers and processors to use to evaluate the safety of their operations during the coronavirus pandemic. This new resource covers employee health practices, including exposure investigation and testing, workspace configuration examples, and potential changes to food safety or HACCP plans.

Homeland Security Updates Essential Critical Workforce Guidance

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has released a<u>revised edition of Guidance on the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce</u>, with version 4.0 reflecting the phased reopening of the nation's economy, noting - for instance - the return of teachers to schools.

The document further encourages:

- Critical and essential staff to follow Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance
- Employers to comply with OSHA requirements
- Remote work, to the extend possible
- Reconsider sick leave policies

The DHS list of "critical and essential" workers continues to include food manufacturing and processing personnel.

Second Round of Wisconsin Farm Support Program Closes Monday, August 24

The Wisconsin Department of Revenue (WDOR) will close a second application period for the Wisconsin Farm Support Program at 11:59 p.m. on Monday, August 24. This program paid out \$41.6 million in \$3,500 increments to nearly 12,000 producers in July, and aims to pay out the balance of the \$50 million Governor Tony Evers directed to it in May from the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act. Only farmers who did not receive support in the first round of the program are eligible for a payment in the second round.
