# **USDA Announces Cheese Purchasing Plan for National School Lunch, Nutrition Programs**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced plans to purchase mozzarella, process and natural American cheddar cheese for the National School Lunch Program and other food nutrition assistance programs.

Solicitations will be issued in September on the <u>Web-based Supply Chain</u> <u>Management (WBSCM) system</u> for deliveries beginning January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

To be eligible to submit offers, potential contractors must meet the <u>AMS vendor</u> <u>qualification requirements</u>. To become a new vendor, contact <u>USDA staff</u>.

## **SBA Issues Updated Loan Forgiveness FAQs**

The U.S. Small Business Administration this week releasedguidance with answers to frequently asked questions regarding the forgiveness of Paycheck Protection Program loans. Most notably, the document details forgiveness of non-payroll expenses, and explains how borrowers should calculate the reduction in their loan forgiveness amount arising from reductions in employee salary or hourly wage, providing three examples for reference.

## File DWD Form for Unemployment Claims Relief

Wisconsin-based WCMA members are reminded to <u>file a unemployment benefits</u> <u>relief form</u> with the state's Department of Workforce Development (DWD) by August 15, if any of their employees were laid off, had hours reduced, or participated in a

WorkShare program between May 16 and June 30. Via form <u>UCB-118823-E</u>, business owners can assert that claims during this time period were due to pandemic impacts on their business, triggering protections from charges to their unemployment account, per <u>Wisconsin Act 185</u>.
