FDA Panel Expected to Approve Moderna Vaccine Today, With 5.9M Doses Ready for Delivery

A Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advisory panel is <u>expected to approve</u> pharmaceutical company Moderna's request for emergency use of its COVID-19 vaccine this afternoon, following its <u>positive review</u> of the vaccine's safety and efficacy earlier this week.

Moderna's vaccine is easier to distribute than Pfizer's, which was approved last week and rolled out nationwide on Monday, because it does not need to be kept at sub-zero temperatures. Moderna's vaccine can be stored for up to 30 days in a regular refrigerator.

Operation Warp Speed officials say they have 5.9 million doses of the Moderna vaccine prepared for delivery next week. Two doses of the Moderna vaccine, spaced 28 days apart, are required for efficacy. Pfizer's vaccine also requires two doses, though they are to be delivered 21 days apart.

Wisconsin Launching New Contact Tracing App

Wisconsin officials today announced they are launching WI Exposure Notification, a new mobile app to assist in the notification of close contacts of COVID-19 positive individuals, on December 23. The free app is available for download now in the Google Play store, while iPhone users can turn the app on in their phone's settings. Wisconsinites will receive a push notification within days of the system's activation offering additional details.

Congress "Close" to Relief Package Agreement

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) called agreement over a \$908 billion coronavirus relief package "close at hand" today, but warned bill terms may not be finalized until the weekend.

The package is expected to include approximately \$330 billion in small business loans, including \$257 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program, as well as a \$300-per-week unemployment enhancer due to last through March, and a one-time stimulus check of approximately \$600 for millions of Americans. It also includes \$26 billion for agriculture, including additional support for direct aid payments to farmers and nutrition programs.

The two most contentious items legislative leaders have discussed in recent days, funding for state and local governments and a liability shield for businesses, have been left out of the package.

WEDC Shares Social Media Tool to Help Consumers Show Business Support Amid Pandemic

Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation officials today shared a new social media tool, designed to help consumers promote their favorite local businesses.
