WCMA Prepares Letter to Federal Officials Urging Preservation of Dairy Industry Access to Dry Ice

As the United States prepares for the chilled distribution of Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine, the demand for dry ice has significantly increased, threatening a <u>necessary</u> <u>supply of 350,000 pounds</u> of dry ice for the production, distribution and storage of dairy cultures used in members' cheese and cultured dairy products.

WCMA is advocating for the dairy industry's access to dry ice, and members are now invited to join in that effort. Please sign on to WCMA's letter to the Department of Defense, Department of Health and Human Services and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention by tomorrow (Friday, December 2) at 12 noon CST.

Register now to join a <u>free COVID-19 webinar</u> on Thursday, December 10 from 1:00-1:45 p.m. focused on the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection's (WDATCP) new COVID-19 protocols. WDATCP's Bureau of Food and Recreational Businesses, Division of Food and Recreational Safety Manager Tim Anderson will present alongside WCMA staff, detailing new pandemic inspection practices, plans to continue timing and sealing services, and inspection debit flexibility secured from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Food and Drug Administration.

WCMA will reserve time at the end of the webinar for WDATCP staff to respond to

member questions. WCMA will present pre-submitted questions from members anonymously; simply send them by Tuesday, December 8 to <u>WCMA staff</u>.

Wisconsin Offering COVID-19 Data by Community

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services added<u>maps and downloadable</u> <u>tables</u> to its website Wednesday, offering COVID-19 data by zip code, municipality, and school district. The mapped metrics present seven-day averages of new case rates, as well as cumulative case counts and rates. They will be updated daily.

Evers Directing \$45M to Wisconsin Restaurants

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today announced he is <u>directing \$45 million</u> in federal assistance to nearly 2,000 restaurants that have suffered pandemic losses. The new program, We're All In for Restaurants," will target businesses with annual revenues of more than \$1 million and less than \$7 million, as previous programs have focused on businesses with smaller annual revenues.
