Mixed Reviews for Food Box Program in Congress, New RFP Expected This Week

In a <u>House Committee on Agriculture hearing</u> held yesterday, <u>lawmakers voiced both</u> <u>support and frustration with the way the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers to</u> <u>Families Food Box program</u> has been run. The first round of contracts delivered 35 million food boxes, about five million short of expectations. However, USDA officials noted they cancelled contracts with some vendors unable to deliver in the second round, and are safeguarding against waste by paying vendors only after delivery of boxes.

USDA is expected to release a new request for proposals (RFP) for the third round of the Farmers to Families Food Box program within the week, and WCMA will alert members to this opportunity.

White House, GOP Lawmakers Reach Agreement on \$1 Trillion Coronavirus Aid Package

Senate Republicans announced Wednesday night they have reached agreement with the White House on a \$1 trillion coronavirus aid package. Few details have been released, but the proposal reportedly includes \$70 billion for K-12 education, \$30 billion for colleges and universities, \$16 billion for coronavirus testing, and an unspecified amount for direct stimulus payments to Americans. Republicans are also reportedly considering a "70 percent replacement" proposal for unemployment. Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin said the plan does not include a payroll tax cut.

The Republicans' agreement will serve as a starting place for negotiations with House Democrats who have already approved a \$3.4 trillion package. Congressional leaders do not expect a plan to pass before the end of this month, when a \$600-perweek unemployment enhancer expires.
