Mixed Reviews for Food Box Program in Congress, New RFP Expected This Week

As WCMA first reported in a member alert last Friday, the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)</u> has announced it is issuing a third round of contracts for its <u>Farmers to Families Food Box program</u>. USDA officials shared a <u>synopsis and solicitation</u> this morning.

USDA announced it will spend the balance of the \$3 billion authorized by Congress for food boxes, an amount expected to total \$600 million. In the third round of the program, USDA will purchase only combination boxes of food, containing fresh produce, dairy products, fluid milk, and meat products. Eligibility will not be limited to previous vendors. USDA officials are saying vendors will be expected to provide more detailed information on their agreements with subcontrators. Distribution is to occur between September 1 and October 31, 2020.

USDA Issues Solicitation for Butter

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has issued a solicitation for the purchase of butter for the Emergency Food Assistance Program. Bids are due Monday, August 10 and questions may be directed to USDA staff.

SBA Shares Procedures for PPP Loan Forgiveness, to Open Platform August 10

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has outlined <u>procedures for Paycheck Protection Program loan forgiveness</u>, noting lenders may begin to submit forgiveness decisions via a secure online platform on Monday, August 10. SBA officials note they will soon issue an interim rule on how to appeal a determination, if forgiveness is not granted.

Republicans to Unveil Aid for Employers and Employees in Coronavirus Relief Bill

Late this afternoon, Senate Republicans plan to release their proposal for the next coronavirus relief bill, worth approximately \$1 trillion, kickstarting negotiations with House Democrats who approved a \$3.4 trillion package in mid-May.

Included in the Republican plan, developed in concert with the White House, are: \$1,200 stimulus checks to American adults earning less than \$75,000, a five-year shield on coronavirus lawsuits against businesses, a more targeted round of forgivable small business loans from the Paycheck Protection Program, and a myriad of tax incentives for employers to rehire, retain and retrofit their offices for employees. WCMA will have more information for members on these proposals in the days ahead.

Republicans are also proposing a \$200-per-week supplement to unemployment aid, and a cap on total unemployment benefits to approximately 70 percent wage replacement. This means the typical unemployment check nationwide will drop below \$400 per week. The \$600 weekly unemployment enhancer added in March officially ends July 31.
