Amid Spike in Coronavirus Cases, Face Mask Mandates Issued and Considered

Nationwide

With the number of coronavirus cases now on the rise in 42 American states, some governors are implementing face mask mandates. Here's a summary of mandates issued within the past week.

• New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy signed an executive order Wednesday

requiring the use of face coverings in public.

- Ohio Governor Mike DeWine Tuesday issued a mandate for the use of face masks in seven counties where COVID-19 is rapidly spreading.
- Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued an order on July 2 mandating the use of face masks in every county with 20 or more cases of COVID-19. Violators are first warned, and then subject to a \$250 fine.
- West Virginia Governor Jim Justice issued a mandate requiring able-bodied citizens age nine and up to wear face masks.

Face masks are also now broadly required in California, Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Oregon, Rhode Island, Virginia, and Washington.

Minnesota Governor Tim <u>Walz said today a decision on a statewide face mask</u> mandate is coming soon.

Wisconsin

In Wisconsin, Governor Tony Evers this week signaled he may<u>try to implement a face mask mandate</u> statewide, though he expects a legal battle. Earlier today, <u>Evers ordered all state employees to begin wearing face masks</u> when at work, and extended the closure of state buildings to the public. Assembly Speaker Robin <u>Vos (R-Rochester) stated he believes a mandate is the right of local government, but called statewide action unnecessary</u>.

On Tuesday, <u>Dane County offficials became the first in Wisconsin to issue a face</u> <u>mask mandate</u>, scheduled to take effect Monday. Other communities are also considering mandates. Here's a look at news coverage of this issue:

Launch of COVID Connect Speeds Wisconsin Coronavirus Testing

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today announced members of the state's National Guard are completing 40 percent more coronavirus tests per hour, following the <u>launch of COVID Connect</u>, which allows a patient to register for a test from their phone. The program was tested this week at the Alliant Energy Center in Madison, and will now be used at all National Guard testing sites in Wisconsin.
