## USDA Renews Some Food Box Contracts, Offers New Contracts to Other Applicants

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced it is<u>extending the</u> <u>contracts of "select vendors"</u> from the first round of the<u>Farmers to Families Food</u> <u>Box Program</u>.

The extensions will carry through to August 30, for contracts worth a total of \$1.16 billion worth of food products. Some vendors delivery amounts or locations have been adjusted based on their demonstrated abilities, or at the vendors' request. Similarly, some contracts were not renewed based on performance challenges, or at the vendors' request.

To fill openings in the program, <u>USDA has also announced it will begin new</u> <u>contracts with a few vendors</u> whose offers were not accepted in the first round, due to technical errors in their proposals. USDA will also solicit new applications.

## **WDATCP Resuming Facility Inspections**

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) Manufactured Food Services Section staff are <u>resuming on-site inspections</u> this week. WDATCP notes Phase 1 of its return to inspection work plan begins with visits to facilities licensed electronically during the pandemic and facilities addressing compliance actions taken by the agency pre-pandemic. Whenever possible during this phase, inspections will be scheduled. WDATCP officials say it will be several months before staff returns to "normal" operations.

All WDATCP staff will be issued personal protective equipment, including face coverings. On-site, agency inspectors will maintain social distancing of at least six feet, practice appropriate personal hygiene, refrain from bringing all but essential equipment into the facilities, and follow department guidelines for sanitizing work equipment.

#### **USDA Solicits Bids for Shredded Mozzarella**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture today issued a<u>solicitation for bids</u> on the purchase of shredded mozzarella cheese. Offers are due June 30, and questions may be directed to <u>USDA staff</u>. USDA posts<u>open solicitations</u> online.

## Pennsylvania Launches \$40M Dairy Aid Program

Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf announced a <u>\$40 million dairy industry aid</u> <u>package</u> Tuesday. The plan includes <u>assistance to food banks</u> and direct payments to dairy farmers of \$1,500. Gov. Wolf has set September 30 as the deadline to apply for assistance through the <u>Dairy Indemnity Program</u>.


