Member Communications Update:

Since March 12, WCMA has been distributing near-daily bulletins alerting members to information and resources related to industry operations and coronavirus (COVID-19). China Requests Food Exporters Declare Products Free of Coronavirus Contamination

Chinese customs authorities are now requesting all food exporters, including dairy manufacturers, sign <u>documents declaring their products free from coronavirus</u> contamination, and that they are in compliance with Chinese law and international guidelines for food safety during the pandemic.

Officials from the <u>U.S. Food and Drug Administration and U.S. Department of Agriculture pushed back in a joint statement</u> Wednesday, noting there is "no evidence that people can contract COVID-19 from food or from food packaging." The agency also noted that some <u>nations are using COVID-19 to scale back on food exports</u>.

CDC Adds Three COVID-19 Symptoms to List

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has added three new symptoms of COVID-19 to its list. Congestion or runny nose, nausea, and diarrhea were added, joining a list that already included fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell and sore throat.

Sign Up for Updates on Food Security Initiative

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) is encouraging those who may want more information about \$15 million Food Security Initiative to sign up for email updates.

The first round of grants, worth \$5 million, will become available in early July. The purpose of the first round is to support adaptations needed at food banks to address greater demand, including refrigeration and delivery programs.

The second round of grants, worth \$10 million, will become available in mid- to late July, and they will be used to support food banks and pantries increase their purchase of Wisconsin-made products. Applicants will be encouraged to partner directly with agricultural producers and food processors.

WCMA will work to keep members informed, as additional details on this program are shared in the coming weeks.


Apply by Monday for Wisconsin Farm Aid

With more than 11,600 applications already filed, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) is reminding eligible farmers to apply for direct payments of between \$1,000-\$3,500 through the Wisconsin Farm Support Program. Eligible farmers include those with gross income between \$35,000 and \$5 million for 2019. The deadline to apply is Monday, June 29.
