Wisconsin Launches County-by-County Tracking, Other States Offer Trend Reports & Resources

Amid a <u>rising rate of coronavirus cases statewide</u>, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) has launched a <u>county-by-county coronavirus tracking program on its website</u>, offering case counts, trajectories, and activity levels ranging from low to high. WDHS is also offering <u>new information on hospital readiness</u>, by state region, including the number of COVID-19 patients hospitalized and number of available hospital beds and ventilators. A <u>list of community testing sites</u>, updated daily, is also available online.

<u>The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> offers a broader look at trends, including daily updates on the number of confirmed cases and state-by-state totals.

USDA Solicits Bids for Cheese, Butter and Yogurt

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is now soliciting bids for multiple dairy products,

for use in Section 32 programs.

- Bids for butter and yogurt contracts are due Tuesday, July 7.
- Bids for processed cheese contracts are due Wednesday, July 8.
- Bids for cheddar cheese contracts are due Monday, July 13.

CAST Publishes Report on Economic Impact of Coronavirus on Food and Agricultural Markets

The Council on Agricultural Science and Technology (CAST) today released a<u>report</u> on the economic impacts of coronavirus on food and agricultural markets. It quantifies the <u>amount of milk disposed thus far</u>during the pandemic at 3.7 million pounds, and details the impact of the <u>loss of food service markets</u>.

School Nutrition Flexibility Extended to June 2021

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is extending certain flexibility in school nutrition programs through June 2021. Nationwide waivers will allow for parent or guardian pick-up of meals for students in distance learning programs, meals offered outside of normal patterns, and meals served outside of group settings.

USDA Now Accepting Online CFAP Applications

The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced Friday it will now accept applications for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) through an online portal.

Final Reminder: Wisconsin Farm Support Program Applications Due Today

Applications for the Wisconsin Farm Support Program are due today, June 29 at 11:59 p.m. This programs direct relief payments of between \$1,000-\$3,500 to qualifying farmers. Applications can be completed online.
