Trump Expected to Sign PPP Flexibility Bill Into Law

Late yesterday, via voice vote, the U.S. <u>Senate approved legislation extending the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and adding flexibility</u> in the use of the aid monies for small business owners. The bill had been approved by the House last week, and President Donald Trump is expected to quickly sign the measure into law.

The bill will extend the eight-week period for loan forgiveness to 24 weeks, or the end of the year, whichever comes first. It will also lower to 60 percent the current requirement that 75 percent of a loan be used on payroll expenses, and give participants the option to defer payroll taxes.

USDA Announces 6.4M Food Boxes Delivered

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service today announced 6.4 million food boxes have now been delivered to Americans facing hunger. Yesterday, USDA had released a <u>statement touting the delivery of 5 million</u> boxes, and promising 40 million by the end of this month.

USDA Invites Stakeholders to CFAP Webinars

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Farm Service Agency today announced a series of webinars designed to deliver Coronavirus Food Assistance Program basics and resources.

The first webinar is set for tomorrow (Friday), June 5 at 2 p.m. (CT), and is intended for stakeholder organizations that serve farmers. Preregistration is open now.

Another webinar, geared specifically for dairy industry leaders, is set for Thursday, June 11 at 2 p.m. (CT), and USDA is recommending preregistration.

USDA plans to share recordings of these webinars, and WCMA will alert members to their availability.

World Dairy Expo 2020 Canceled

World Dairy Expo organizers announced today they are <u>canceling the event</u> for 2020, based on Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance and county restrictions on large gatherings. World Dairy Expo 2021 is set for September 28-October 2.
