Food Box Program Questioned While USDA Touts Growing Delivery Numbers

Even as the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) touted<u>delivery of 9.6 million</u> <u>boxes of food as of today</u>, Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer and the Democratic members of the Senate Committee on Agriculture are <u>calling for more</u> <u>transparency</u> in the agency's administration of the Farmers to Families Food Box program.

USDA officials say 40 million boxes food boxes will be delivered by June 30. Program contracts worth \$1.2 billion were awarded in early May.

USDA Sees Strong Demand for CFAP Dollars

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reports it has processed more than \$1.4 billion in payments to more than 80,000 farmers nationwide who applied for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP). More than \$337 million has been directed, thus far, to dairy farmers.

Program progress updates are released each Monday at 1:00 p.m. (CT) on <u>USDA's</u> <u>website</u>, with the report breaking down payments by state and agricultural industry.

WEDC, CDC Guidance on Safely Reopening Retail

WCMA has heard from members who have interest in reopening their retail stores, beyond the curbside pick-up many employed over the past three months. Guidance on how to safely reopen retail shops is available via the <u>Wisconsin Economic</u> <u>Development Corporation</u> and the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>. Please note, it is critical to check with county public health officials to determine what, if any, local restrictions are in place.

Wisconsin Expands Access to Food Aid

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) announced today that the U.S. Department of Agriculture has approved of the agency's expansion of The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). WDHS changes will make food aid available to all Wisconsin households with incomes below 300 percent of the federal poverty level. For a household of one, that means an income of \$38,280 each year, and the level goes up with every additional family member. Complete details, including a directory of TEFAP pantries, are available on the <u>WDHS website</u>.
