# **Evers Issues "Safer at Home" Order, Exempts Dairy Processing, Agriculture & Other Essential Workers**

Moments ago, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers issued a "Safer at Home" order to slow the spread of coronavirus. The order takes effect at 8 a.m. Wednesday, March 25 and remains in effect until 8 a.m. on Friday, April 24, or until another order is issued. The detailed, 14-page order is available here.

In Section 10, beginning on page six, Evers notes that all food production, distribution, and fulfillment businesses are exempt from this order. Essential businesses and operations are further defined in Section 13, beginning on page nine, and include all businesses listed in the <u>U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Memorandum on Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce</u>, which includes agriculture and food production. The Evers order also specifically calls out food and beverage production, transport and agriculture, in Section 13, Part C.

Industry suppliers are noted in Section 13, Part R, wherein businesses that sell, manufacture or supply other essential business can remain open. Food, food additives, ingredients are noted in this supplier list, as well as sanitary equipment, chemicals, paper products, soaps and detergents and more. Likewise, critical trades in building and construction, noted in Section 13, Part N, can remain open, including building and construction trades, fabricators, pipe trades, plumbers, electricians, masonry and more.
