White House, Congress Reach Deal on \$2 Trillion Economic Stimulus Package

The <u>White House and Congressional leaders struck a deal</u>early Wednesday morning over an unprecedented \$2 trillion economic stimulus package amid the coronavirus pandemic. The Senate is planning a vote later today, while the House is likely to vote on the bill before the end of the week.

Full details have not yet been released, but Congressional leaders note the deal includes \$500 billion in loans to distressed companies, \$350 billion in small business loans, \$250 billion in unemployment insurance, and \$250 billion in direct payments to individuals and families.

Congressional leaders have provided the greatest detail, thus far, on direct payment plans. Individuals who earn \$75,000 or less annually would get direct payments of \$1,200 each, while married couples earning up to \$150,000 would receive \$2,400, plus \$500 per child. The payments scale down by income, phasing out at \$99,000 for singles and \$198,000 for couples without children.

WCMA staff will provide additional analysis on business aids and elements of the bill specific to the dairy processing community tomorrow.

Self-Certification Letters for Wisconsin Businesses

Earlier this week, WCMA shared this <u>form crafted by partners at IDFA</u> for the selfcertification of "critical essential" workers in the dairy processing industry. Today, in light of Wisconsin Governor Tony <u>Evers' "safer at home" order</u>, we're also providing these resources for self-certification for Wisconsin-based members:

WEDC: Retail Cheese Shops May Remain Open

WCMA has confirmed with Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation leaders that <u>Evers' "safer at home" order</u> allows the retail cheese stores that many members operate to remain open.

With this noted, cheesemakers may still wish to consider voluntary store closures to limit public public access to facilities and the risk of virus transmission.

WDATCP Adopts Modified Bulk Milk Weigher and Samplers Licensing Process

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection has suspended non-essential activities. To ensure that new Bulk Milk Weigher and Samplers (BMWS) are able to perform their duties, the agency has adopted a modified licensing process. WDATCP Secures IMS Extension from FDA

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection has obtained an extension from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for Wisconsin BTUs, Grade A plants, and labs due for IMS recertification in the next 60 days.

U.S. DOT Issues Certain CDL Waivers, Extensions

The U.S. Department of Transportation has <u>issued guidance</u> in response to the coronavirus emergency, noting extensions of CDL validity and waivers of certain types of certification and testing for CDLs.
