# WDATCP Inspectors Will Follow Industry SOPs, Submit to Temperature Checks, Wear PPE

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) today announced <u>all inspectors will follow industry standard operating procedures</u> that comply with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Occupational Safety and Health Administration guidelines.

Businesses may require inspectors use personal protective equipment and submit to temperature screenings, though they may not retain a WDATCP employee's protected health information, including a temperature reading.

WCMA staff has worked closely with WDATCP officials on this important change in practice, and we thank Interim Secretary Randy Romanski, Division of Food and Recreational Safety Administrator Steve Ingham, and Director of Field Services Tim Anderson for their responsiveness to industry needs.

## **Evers: Retail Stores May Reopen with Restrictions**

With <u>Wisconsin now meeting three of six criteria in the 'Badger Bounce Back' plan</u> Governor Tony Evers today announced all retail stores may reopen, so long as they limit the number of customers to five. Other, essential businesses may remain open as previously determined. Complete details are available in <u>Emergency Order 36</u>, and the updated <u>Safer at Home FAQ</u>.
