## **CDC Offers Brief Reopening Guide**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention today released a brief guide to reopening the United States, with one-page 'decision trees' designed to help workplaces, schools, youth programs and camps, child care programs, and mass transit systems.

As a reminder, the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation has published <u>14</u> <u>industry-specific guidance documents</u> for reopening on its Focus Forward page.

#### Wisconsin Businesses Navigate Reopening Under Patchwork of Local Policies

Following the Wisconsin Supreme Court action this week to strike down an extension of the Safer at Home order issued by Governor Tony Evers, the state's <u>business owners are now navigating a dynamic patchwork</u> of local policies to reopen. <u>Republican leaders are now signaling their preference for local control</u> while Gov. Evers continues work on emergency rules.

Sixteen of Wisconsin's 72 <u>counties now have stay-at-home</u> or other public health orders. Leaders from Brown and Kenosha Counties today rescinded their earlier orders, due to potential legal challenges.

## WEDC Adds PPE Providers to Supplier Network Site

The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation officials today announced the addition of personal protective equipment providers as a category on its Wisconsin Supplier Network site. Suppliers can be searched and sorted by those making masks, gloves, sanitizers or face shields. Suppliers not yet on the site are encouraged to create a free listing.

## DATCP, DFW Lift Assessment on Disposed Milk

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, in partnership with Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin (DFW) has announced <u>the state's milk</u> <u>assessment will be lifted for all disposed milk</u>, effective now and through the end of the federal major disaster declaration.

In Wisconsin, farmers are assessed ten cents per hundredweight on the sale of their milk, with monies directed to DFW for promotion, research and development.

Dairy farmers in Wisconsin and across the country are also assessed five cents per hundredweight for national promotions. The U.S. Department of Agriculture noted in recent guidance that when milk is disposed, there is no requirement to pay the federal checkoff assessment, even in cases where the producer is paid for the disposed milk.
