Evers Withdraws Scope Statement for "Safer At Home" Replacement After Republican Rejection

Moments ago, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers <u>withdrew a scope statement on</u> <u>emergency rules</u> to replace his Safer At Home order, after Republican lawmakers with veto authority stated their opposition to his plans.

Neither the Evers Administration nor Wisconsin Department of Health Services immediately commented on the withdrawal.

House Relief Bill with Dairy Recourse Loan Proposal Unlikely to See Senate Action

Members of the U.S. House of Representatives approved a proposal authored by Democrats late Friday to provide \$3 trillion in coronavirus relief, including direct cash payments to Americans, an unemployment benefits extension, and hazard pay for front-line workers. The package also includes a proposal backed by WCMA; the Recourse Loan Program for Commercial Processors of Dairy Products would make \$500 million plan in working capital loans available to dairy processors, packagers,

merchants, marketers, wholesalers and distributors carrying heavier inventories due to coronavirus order delays.

The bill is regarded as dead on arrival in the Republican-controlled Senate, following a veto warning from President Donald Trump.

Evers Announces \$75M Grant Program for Wisconsin Small Businesses

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today announced the state will release \$75 million in small business grants as part of the "We're All In" initiative from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC).

Funded largely by federal aid, the program will provide \$2,500 cash grants to offset some of the costs of business interruption, or for health and safety improvements, wages and salaries, rent, mortgages, and inventory.

Businesses must have 20 or fewer full-time employees and must not have received other WEDC support related to the coronavirus pandemic to be eligible. Up to 30,000 businesses will receive grants. More details, including application forms, will be available later this month and businesses will be able to apply for grants in June.

USDA Now Issuing Grants to Support CO2 Access

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has launched an online portal to begin accepting applications for \$100 million in <u>Higher Blends Infrastructure Incentive Program</u> competitive grants. This program is designed to expand the sale and availability of affordable ethanol and biodiesel fuels, including CO2 used in the dairy processing industry, now in short supply.

WDATCP Announces Online Sign Up for BMWS License Renewal Inspections

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection today announced <u>online sign up</u> for bulk milk weigher and sample (BMWS) license renewal inspections, which are required once every two years. These brief checks will be held in eleven locations in August and September.
