PPP Loan Forgiveness Timeline May Be Extended

U.S. Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin noted Thursday that he is working with Congress on a proposal to lengthen the time period small businesses have to spend Paycheck Protection Program support and still be eligible for loan forgiveness. Mnuchin said in an interview with *The Hill*, "There is bipartisan support to extend [the eight-week period] to 10 or 12 weeks."

Senate Republicans are considering a stand-alone bill to extend the PPP spending period to 16 weeks, and House Democrats are expected to bring similar legislation to the floor next week.

CDC: Coronavirus 'Does Not Spread Easily' on Surfaces or Objects

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has issued <u>updated guidance</u>, noting that virus that causes COVID-19 is spreading very easily and sustainably between people, but that "it does not spread easily in other ways," including "touching surfaces or objects."

WDATCP Seeks Information on Food Box Decisions

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection Interim Secretary Randy Romanski sent a letter to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, seeking information on how the agency made determinations related to the Farmers to Families Food Box program.

In the letter, Romanski notes that Wisconsin-based companies were awarded less than one percent of all dairy product and fluid milk program purchases.
