USDA Announces Plans for More Dairy Purchases

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today announced<u>plans to purchase</u> <u>more dairy products</u> for distribution to food nutrition assistance programs. <u>Solicitations will be released soon</u> for salted butter, cheddar cheese chunks, various sizes of packages of shredded cheddar, packages of shredded cheddar, and instant milk. Questions can be directed to <u>USDA staff</u>.

FDA Offers Labeling Flexibility

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is granting temporary regulatory flexibility on food labeling requirements, in response to manufacturers' challenges in sourcing some ingredients during the coronavirus pandemic. The <u>FDA guidance</u> <u>document</u> notes minor formulation changes may not trigger label updates, so long as ingredients do not introduce allergens or foods known to cause sensitivities.

Make Your Voice Heard on Bipartisan Billion-Dollar Proposal for Ag Supply Chain

Last week, U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Susan Collins (R-ME), and Angus King (I-ME), along with U.S. Representatives Xochitl Torres Small (D-NM) and Dusty Johnson (R-SD), introduced the <u>Farming Support to States Act</u>, which would provide \$1 billion in flexible funding for states and agricultural stakeholders to respond to challenges in the industry's supply chain.

WCMA is lobbying for this proposal, and welcomes any member with an interest in the legislation to <u>get in touch</u>. Sen. Baldwin's office is collecting quotes from industry

leaders in support of the bill for the ongoing advocacy campaign.
