USDA Announces Plan for Additional \$120M in Dairy Product Purchases

The <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today announced plans for \$470 million</u> <u>in additional food purchases</u> with Section 32 funding, including \$120 million in dairy product buys.

Specific types of purchases will be determined by industry requests, market analysis, and food bank needs. USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) will begin issuing solicitations in June, with deliveries to start in July.

Solicitations will be posted to the <u>AMS Open Purchases Request website</u> once available, and shared via WCMA member bulletins and newsletters.

SBA Updates PPP Guidance, Addresses Employment Question

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) yesterday released<u>updated</u> <u>guidance</u> on the use of the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) and loan forgiveness.

Addressing a pressing concern for some in food processing industry, SBA notes that a borrower's PPP loan forgiveness amount will not be reduced if the borrower laid off an employee, offered to rehire the same employee, but the employee declined that offer. Employees and employer should be aware that employees who reject reemployment offers may forfeit eligibility for continued unemployment compensation.

Wisconsin Expands Mobile Testing Statewide

As part of the <u>'Badger Bounce Back'</u>, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today announced a <u>plan to make Wisconsin one of the top states in testing per capita</u> Wisconsin is now prepared to provide 85,000 COVID-19 tests per week, ensuring that everyone in the state who needs a test will receive a test.

Last Friday, <u>Evers announced the Wisconsin National Guard will run free, mobile</u> <u>COVID-19 testing sites</u>, and <u>more sites were announced</u> over the weekend. Here's a look at where free, drive-through testing will be available in the coming days:

Evers Calls on Purdue to Address CO2 Shortage

WCMA is aware of our members' concerns for adequate, affordable supplies of CO2 to safely package cheese products, and we have been working with the Office of Governor Tony Evers, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP), and industry partners to bring this concern to USDA and legislators.

We can now report that on Friday, May 1, Gov. Evers sent a<u>letter to U.S.</u> <u>Department of Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue</u> expressing concern over "the projected acute shortage in CO2" and asking urging him to provide financial resources to Wisconsin's corn growers and ethanol producers.

WCMA will continue to advocate for member interests related to available CO2 supplies. Please contact <u>WCMA Executive Director John Umhoefer</u> to share concerns or questions.

Court to Review Safer at Home Order Tomorrow

The Wisconsin <u>Supreme Court is scheduled to hear oral arguments tomorrow</u> in a lawsuit from Republican lawmakers seeking to end Governor Tony Evers' Safer at Home order, which was extended by Department of Health Services Secretary-

designee Andrea Palm last month to May 26. WCMA will keep members informed of major developments.
