USDA Offers \$100M in Grants for Biofuels, Supporting CO2 Access

The <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture announced this week</u> it will make up to \$100 million in competitive grants available for ethanol and other biofuels manufacturers, an action that is expected to expand access to affordable CO2.

As noted in Monday's member bulletin, WCMA has been working with elected leaders and industry partners to address growing industry concerns over limited CO2 supplies. Late last week, Wisconsin Governor Tony <u>Evers sent a letter to USDA</u> <u>Secretary</u> Sonny Perdue, calling for support for the ethanol industry.

SBA Again Updates PPP Guidance

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has offered updates to its<u>Paycheck</u> <u>Protection Program FAQ</u> twice in the last two days, adding clarity on loan repayment and employee headcounts, for those organizations which operate both domestically and internationally.

Wisconsin Expands Community Testing, Launches New Online Tool Noting Sites

On Wednesday, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services launched<u>a new tool</u> to help people find free COVID-19 testing sites throughout the state. The tool's searchable map notes testing site locations, contact information, hours of operation, and guidance on how to schedule an appointment.

Earlier in the week, Governor Tony Evers announced an expansion of testing, and on Wednesday, <u>more than 4,000 people were tested for COVID-19</u>, a new high for the state.

Wisconsin Supreme Court Deliberates Safer at Home Order Extension

Wisconsin's Supreme Court continues to deliberate a case brought by Republican lawmakers arguing Department of Health Services Secretary-designee Andrea Palm overstepped her authority in extending Governor Tony Evers' safer at home order.

Should the court determine the order invalid, the Legislature has asked the court to keep the order in place for six days, so that new rules might be determined.
