### USDA Approves \$1.2B in Contracts for Farmers to Families Food Box Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today approved \$1.2 billion in contracts through its new Farmers to Families Food Box Program, including \$317 million for a variety of dairy products and \$175 million for combination boxes of dairy, fresh produce, or meat products. USDA's list of Food Box suppliers includes WCMA members Masters Gallery Foods, approved for dairy food boxes, and Prairie Farms, approved for dairy food boxes and fluid milk.

### **USDA Offers Milk Contracts, Donation Flexibility**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today issued two separate requests for proposals for fluid milk purchases, with submissions due May 22. <u>One solicitation</u> directs deliveries to Idaho, Massachusetts, Montana, Vermont and Washington, while <u>the other directs deliveries to 24 states</u>, including all of the Midwest.

USDA also announced today it will <u>waive certain documentation requirements</u> in the Commodity Specifications for Fluid Milk and Milk Products Eligible for the Milk Donation Reimbursement Program.

### **Evers Shares Reopening Strategies for Businesses, WEDC Guidelines Include WCMA Input**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers today shared <u>COVID-19 guidelines and best safety</u> <u>practices for businesses to follow when they reopen</u>. Downloadable brochures, issued by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, offer both <u>general</u>

guidance and industry-specific advice for 14 business types.

WCMA, along with its partners at the Center for Dairy Research and Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin, was pleased to contribute to guidance documents for <u>manufacturers</u> and for <u>agriculture</u>.

### State Unemployment Fund May Be Gone by October

The State of Wisconsin may have to borrow money from the federal government to pay unemployment benefits, if the high rate of joblessness continues. Analysis from the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development (DWD) reported Thursday shows the state's \$1.8 billion Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund is on track to be depleted by October.

Nine states have already indicated they plan to ask for loans including California, Illinois, Texas, New York, Connecticut, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Ohio and West Virginia.
