### **Evers Extends Wisconsin Mask Mandate**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers Wednesday announced he will sign orders this week declaring a State of Emergency and extending the statewide face mask mandate through mid-January.

Earlier this week, the Wisconsin Supreme Court heard <u>arguments in a lawsuit</u> challenging Governor Tony Evers' authority to issue multiple health emergency orders. A ruling in the case is expected in several weeks.

# **Evers, GOP Leaders Detail COVID-19 Legislation**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers this week detailed a <u>package of COVID-19 bills</u>, including proposals to ban evictions and foreclosures through the end of the year, waiving the one-week waiting period for unemployment benefits, and requiring insurers to cover COVID-19 testing, treatment, and vaccination.

Meantime, Assembly Speaker Robin Vos (R-Rochester) noted Wednesday that Republicans favor boosts to the state's COVID-19 testing system, including doubling the number of contact tracers, reform of the unemployment insurance system, and additional small business relief.

Evers noted his expectation that Republican leaders will meet with him Friday to discuss the terms of a legislative package, which Vos said could be voted on in December.

### **Walz Orders New Restrictions in Minnesota**

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz Wednesday announced a four-week "dial-back" in an

effort to curb the spread of COVID-19. Issuing orders which take effect Friday, Walz is prohibiting indoor social gatherings of any size, limiting restaurants and bars to take-out and delivery only, and closing gyms, movie theaters and other indoor entertainment facilities.

## **CDC Updates Thanksgiving Gathering Guidance**

Officials from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Thursday <u>updated</u> <u>guidance</u> related to Thanksgiving gatherings, asking Americans to avoid all travel for the holiday and to take various precautionary measures with anyone who is not an immediate member of their household.

## IRS, Treasury Clarify Stance on PPP & Deductions

The Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Department of Treasury late Wednesday issued joint guidance noting that business owners who "reasonably believe" their Paycheck Protection Program loan will be forgiven in the future may not deduct those costs from their taxes, regardless of their forgiveness filing status.

### **CFAP Round 2 Payments Now Total \$10 Billion**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture this week reports it has distributed \$10 billion in direct relief payments to farmers via the second round of its Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP), including \$980 million to dairy farmers. USDA will continue to accept applications for CFAP 2 monies through December 11.
