Lawsuit Filed to Prevent Release of List of COVID-19 Business Outbreaks in Wisconsin

Wisconsin Manufacturers & Commerce, together with the Muskego and New Berlin Area Chambers of Commerce, today <u>filed a lawsuit</u> to stop the release of a list of businesses that experienced COVID-19 outbreaks between March and the start of July, arguing that records are protected by patient confidentiality laws and that disclosure will irreparably harm businesses.

Governor Tony Evers had alerted WCMA of his administration's intent to release on Friday the list, following months of talks between the Department of Health Services and an attorney for the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*, one of the news outlets which requested information under the state's open records law.

The Evers Administration has noted that approximately 1,000 businesses are included in the list. WCMA staff has contacted all affected members directly.

WCMA staff has prepared a <u>fact sheet</u> on the dairy processing industry's response to the coronavirus pandemic, which is available to all members as a general resource. WCMA staff is also available to help with the development of a tailored statement or news release for your business, if needed. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today announced it has <u>awarded</u> <u>contracts</u> for the delivery of 82 million pounds of mozzarella in 2021 to WCMA members Dairy Farmers of America and Saputo Cheese USA, as well as Leprino Foods and Miceli Dairy Products.

USDA Announces Delivery of 100M Food Boxes

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) this week announced it has invoiced 100.7 million food boxes, as part of its Farmers to Families Food Box program. The boxes, which include dairy products, will continue to be delivered through 2020.
