Bipartisan Coalition Pushes For Streamlined PPP Forgiveness Paperwork for Small Loans

A bipartisan Congressional coalition led by Senators Kevin Cramer (R-ND) and Bob Menendez (D-NJ) is championing a bill that would require the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to create a simple, one-page attestation form to forgive covered Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans of less than \$150,000. SBA has provided approximately 4.2 million PPP loans within that parameter, though they account for only 26 percent of all PPP funds delivered.

The legislative push for streamlined PPP loan forgiveness comes as business and banking advocates attest to complications. One <u>industry estimate</u> shows current paperwork required to reverify loan use will take small business owners between 20 and 100 hours to complete.

Senate to Vote on Coronavirus Relief Package Today, Though Bill is Unlikely to Advance

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) is moving forward with a <u>vote on a scaled-back coronavirus relief package</u> later today. Democrats are expected to oppose it en masse, meaning the bill would not advance.

The legislation includes \$20 billion in aid for agriculture, a \$300 weekly booster in unemployment benefits payments through the end of the year, more funding for the Paycheck Protection Program, and COVID-19 liability protection for businesses.

Democrats are pushing for state and municipal aid, and another round of stimulus checks for Americans.

Political insiders now do not expect a coronavirus relief deal to be struck prior to the

November election.

CFAP Tops \$9.7 Billion, Deadline Tomorrow

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is reporting Coronavirus Food Assistance Program payments have now topped \$9.7 billion, with \$1.7 billion in relief to dairy producers. The deadline to apply for CFAP aid is Friday, September 11.
