USDA Announces \$1B in Food Box Contracts

The U.S. Department of Agriculture today announced its has approved \$1 billion in contracts for the third round of its Farmers to Families Food Box program. A full list of approved suppliers will be posted online after 4 p.m. (CT) today.

Earlier this week, USDA announced it had distributed more than 90 million food boxes in support of American farmers and families affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

State of Wisconsin Now Offering Free, Confidential COVID-19 Workplace Consultations

The State of Wisconsin has alerted WCMA to a brand-new offering to support employers' efforts to prevent the spread of coronavirus within their workplaces.

The Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene (WSLH) has launched afree, confidential consultative service to help businesses develop COVID-19 exposure prevention, preparedness, and response plans, and identify potential administrative, engineering, and PPE controls. All businesses will receive a service term agreement, and consultations can be delivered via on-site or virtual visit.

Trump, CDC Director Differ on Vaccine Timetable

Testifying before a U.S. Senate subcommittee on Wednesday, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention director Dr. Robert Redfield said a limited supply of

coronavirus vaccine may be available between November and December of this year, but that it was unlikely to be available to the general public until the summer or fall of 2021. Redfield also testified that wearing a face mask might offer more protection against the spread of coronavirus than a vaccine.

In a later news conference, President Donald Trump said that he thinks Redfield "made a mistake" when he said that a vaccine will not be widely available until 2021, and "under no circumstance will it be as late as the doctor said." Trump reiterated his belief that the U.S. is ready to distribute the vaccine to much of the country whenever it is available, saying that could be as early as next month.

USDA Awards Contracts for Cheddar and Swiss

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has <u>awarded contracts</u> totaling \$10 million in value for the purchase of cheddar and swiss cheeses from WCMA members Dairy Farmers of America, Great Lakes Cheese Company, Masters Gallery Foods, Schreiber Foods, Winona Foods, as well as Gossner Foods.

CFAP Tops \$9.9 Billion As Deadline Passes

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is reporting Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) payments have now topped \$9.9 billion, with \$1.7 billion in relief to dairy producers. The deadline for CFAP applications was September 11, though producers impacted by natural disasters in Louisiana, Oregon, and Texas now have through October 9 to ask for aid.
