# WCMA Webinar: New COVID-19 Employer Guidance and Free, Confidential COVID-19 Consultations

Register now to join a free COVID-19 webinar available exclusively to members of the Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association on Thursday, October 1 from 1-2 p.m. (CDT).

Wisconsin regulators will highlight new operations guidance for Wisconsin employers on mitigating the risk of viral transmission, and will unveil a new, free service offering confidential COVID-19 consultations by experts from the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene. This service is designed to support development of a COVID-19 Exposure Prevention, Preparedness and Response Plan and identify ideas for administrative, engineering and PPE controls to reduce risk of exposure in your workplace.

Wisconsin Department of Health Services COVID-19 Occupational Safety and Health Program Epidemiologist Komi Modji and Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene COVID-19 Consultant Kelli Rush are set to present on October 1, alongside WCMA staff.

**WCMA Advocates for Streamlined PPP Forgiveness** 

WCMA has joined with 14 other trade associations to lobby the state's Congressional delegation in support of a streamlined Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) forgiveness process. In a coalition letter sent earlier this week, WCMA called on elected leaders to back Senate Bill 4117 or House Resolution 7777, proposals which, if enacted, would forgive PPP loans of less than \$150,000 upon the borrower's completion of a simple, one-page forgiveness document. Simplifying the forgiveness application process for the smallest borrowers will provide additional relief to these businesses by eliminating the existing requirement to spend several hours dealing with onerous paperwork or expending precious dollars on consultants to comply with existing requirements.

WCMA will keep members informed of relevant developments.

# **Evers Directs \$13M in CARES Funding to Expand Broadband Access, College COVID-19 Testing**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers announced this week he is directing \$5 million on Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) funding to <a href="mailto:expand-rural-broadband-access">expand-rural-broadband-access</a> by December 30. Evers is also directing \$8.3 million to support <a href="COVID-19">COVID-19 testing on college campuses</a> across the state.
