CDC Advises States to Prep for Vaccine Distribution

The <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has notified public health</u> <u>officials across the country to prepare now to distribute a coronavirus vaccine</u> as soon as late October or early November. In a letter, the CDC stressed that the timeline was hypothetical, noting "the COVID-19 vaccine landscape is evolving and uncertain, and these scenarios may evolve as more information is available."

Last week, the CDC shared <u>preliminary guidelines for the distribution of a</u> <u>coronavirus vaccine</u>, first prioritizing health care workers and those most vulnerable to severe COVID-19 complications. The plan also prioritizes the nation's critical and essential workforce, including those employed in agriculture and food processing.

USDA Reports 66% Hike in Farmer Relief Payments

The U.S. Department of Agriculture today reported that <u>direct government farm</u> <u>payments are now forecasted to total \$37.2 billion in 2020</u>, an increase of \$14.7 billion, or approximately 66 percent. The projected increase is a direct results of coronavirus relief programs.
