Shutdown Enters Day 28, Impacts U.S. Dairy Industry

The shutdown of the United States federal government has now entered day 28, making it the longest in the nation's history. Impacts on the agricultural industry are widespread, though agency heads are now working to address the most pressing concerns.

On Wednesday, U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue ordered 2,500 employees back to work without pay at half of the country's Farm Service Agency locations, noting the offices would be open for three days to address producers' concerns over existing farm loans. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has also demanded 150 furloughed employees resume inspections of high-risk foods.

Unfortunately, implementation of the new Farm Bill remains at a standstill, and the release of several key USDA reports, including the much-anticipated World Agriculture Supply and Demand Estimates, has been delayed. The start of U.S. trade negotiations with the E.U. and Japan have been delayed due to the federal government shutdown, as well.


WCMA Members Well Represented at Winter Fancy Food Show
