Center for Dairy Research Building Project Advances

Center for Dairy Research building project designers this week released updated images of their plans for facility, including the first peeks inside the building (see below).

<u>Final design documents</u> were posted for bid on February 9, and are being reviewed now by potential contractors.

Here are some of the important upcoming project deadlines:

- * March 13: Bid deadline for mechanical, electrical and plumbing contractors
- * March 27: Bid deadline for general prime contractors

Once bids are submitted, the UW Board of Regents and the Wisconsin Department of Administration's Building Commission must approve the successful bid and authorize construction. Following these final approvals, expected in April, a construction start date will be determined.

University officials note that the phasing of the construction work is being planned to minimize downtime for both the Dairy Plant and CDR.

Congressional Members Call on Leader to Address Section 199A Inequity

Late last month, 85 Republican members of Congress signed and delivered **this letter** to Speaker Paul Ryan and Majority Leader Mitch McConnell calling for changes to Section 199A in the tax code to restore the competitive balance in the agricultural marketplace.

Specifically, the letter says any remedy should retroactively restore the competitive marketplace for producers and replicate the benefits co-ops and farmers received under Section 199, before the enactment of Section 199A.

Ag Producer Security Changes Approved, Soon to be Law

Last week, the Wisconsin State Senate and Assembly unanimously approved <u>Senate Bill 599</u>, related to changes to the Ag Producer Security Program.

Staffers for Governor Scott Walker have assured WCMA that he will sign the bill into law, though a date and time have yet to be set.



WCMA supports SB 599, and our Association thanks the members of the Policy Committee who actively lobbied in favor of it.


