Senate, Assembly Plan Budget Votes Next Week

After months of negotiations and meetings, Wisconsin's Joint Finance Committee (JFC) wrapped up its work on the biennial budget on Thursday, June 13. The State Assembly is set to vote on the proposal on Tuesday, June 25, with Senate leaders expecting a vote later the same week. Here's a look at what this version of the budget holds for the dairy industry.

Dairy Innovation Hub

WCMA has advocated alongside partners in the producer community for the creation of the Dairy Innovation Hub, a program which would direct millions of dollars to the University of Wisconsin-Madison, University of Wisconsin-Platteville, and University of Wisconsin-River Falls for dairy industry research and development projects and training initiatives. The JFC-approved budget designates \$1 million in this fiscal year for the program, with an additional \$7.8 million to follow, should specific plans be approved.

WDATCP Initiatives

As WCMA had asked, JFC members agreed to grant the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection more authority to reclassify some staff, with the hope that the agency could retain more dairy sanitarians and specialists. The committee did not approve increases in funding for the agency's dairy processor grant program or exports program, but did preserve current levels of support.

WDNR Initiatives

Funding for the Wastewater Division at the WDNR is preserved, as WCMA had asked, to ensure timely responses to industry inquiries and applications.

Transportation

WCMA has advocated for a long-term funding source for transportation projects, including a reasonable gas tax increase. JFC members rejected Governor Tony Evers' eight-cent increase, approving only certain fee increases and borrowing.

Manufacturing and Agriculture Tax Credit

WCMA requested that state lawmakers preserve the Manufacturing and Agriculture Tax Credit; this tool remains unchanged in the JFC budget.

Following legislative action, Gov. Evers has six business days to sign or veto the proposal in whole or in part. He has not yet committed to specific action, and WCMA will keep members informed of major developments.

WDATCP Secretary Pfaff Visits Arena Cheese

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection Secretary Brad Pfaff and members of his staff joined WCMA in an educational tour of WCMA member Arena Cheese on Monday, June 17, hosted by Wisconsin Master Cheesemaker Bill Hanson.

Secretary Pfaff expressed his dedication to supporting industry growth. His agency has worked to translate key dairy licensing exams into Spanish, at members' request. We are also communicating with the Secretary and his staff about extending the validity of rBST affidavits.

WCMA Testifies at Water Quality Task Force Hearing

Earlier this year, Assembly Speaker Robin Vos announced the formation of a Water Quality Task Force. The mission of this group, chaired by Rep. Todd Novak (R-Dodgeville), is to gather information and make policy recommendations to improve the quality of both surface water and ground water in Wisconsin.

On Wednesday, June 12, WMCA Executive Director John Umhoefer testified in a Task Force meeting held in Mauston, Wisconsin, detailing what dairy processors are doing to protect the state's natural resources, and championing a proposed nutrient management trading system.

<u>Additional hearings</u> will follow in Green Bay, Marinette, Menomonie, Racine, Stevens Point, Superior, and Tomahawk. WCMA will keep members informed of opportunities to weigh in on water quality issues.

CDR Project Review Underway

Representatives from the Wisconsin Department of Administration, University of Wisconsin-Madison, and the dairy industry, including WCMA Executive Director John Umhoefer, continue to meet to discuss progress on the Center for Dairy Research/Babcock Dairy Hall construction project.





The project team is working to identify a risk management firm to conduct a third-party review of project plans with the goal of cost reduction and design quality. The group will meet frequently over the next few weeks, and plans to share details on the

construction schedule in early July. Center for Dairy Research operations are continuing, as is work at the site, with construction of footings for the new addition currently underway.

WCMA will continue to keep members informed on project developments via this e-newsletter.

Lawmakers from 15 States Visit Klondike Cheese



WCMA thanks member company Klondike Cheese Company for hosting lawmakers from Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Maryland, Michigan, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Oregon, Tennessee, and Wisconsin on June 7 for a tour of its facilities. This event, held in conjunction with an annual meeting of the National Conference of State Legislatures, provided elected leaders with insight on industry opportunities and challenges, and on policy changes that support growth.

Trade Updates: Mexico Ratifies USMCA, U.S.-China Talks Set for Next Week

On Wednesday, June 19, Mexico became the first country to ratify the United States-Mexico-Canada (USMCA) trade agreement, in spite of a tumultuous month of tariff threats from President Donald Trump. U.S. approval hinges on Democrats who have been pushing for stricter labor standards and enforcement mechanisms, with less than a month of legislative days left in Congress before the summer recess.



Meanwhile, <u>U.S. and Chinese representatives met this week</u> to jumpstart talks set for June 28 between President Trump and Chinese President X Jinping. Trump has already imposed 25 percent tariffs on \$250 billion of Chinese goods, and is threatening tariffs on another \$325 billion of goods, covering nearly all the remaining Chinese imports into the United States. China has responded with steep retaliatory tariffs on many U.S. exports, including dairy products.
