Trump Touts USMCA Trade Deal in Wisconsin

In a visit to Wisconsin on Friday, July 12, President Donald Trump promoted the United States-Mexico-Canada (USMCA) trade agreement, saying that it would help to rebuild manufacturing and agricultural businesses. Trump noted to the crowd, "Some of the farmers are doing well. We're over the hump."

On the same day, Wisconsin Senator Tammy Baldwin detailed the impact of trade wars with China, Mexico, Canada and the European Union in <u>this letter</u>.

WDNR Calls for Public Comments on Water Quality Rule Changes

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) has opened a public comment period on proposed rule revisions related to the assessment of lakes and streams in the state.

These rules describe how the biology of a lake or stream, such as its fish, insect, plant and algae communities, are used to assess its overall health. The rule updates also establish how algae and plants will be used to determine whether a water body is responding to elevated phosphorus levels and whether it may need a different phosphorus criterion. <u>Click here</u> to access rule language; for reference, the pertinent rule numbers are WY-23-13 and WT-17-12.

A joint public hearing will be held for both rules at 10 a.m. on Thursday, September 12, with simultaneous telepresence in Madison and Green Bay. Written comments will be accepted <u>via email</u> until September 20, 2019. Please contact <u>WCMA staff</u> with any questions or concerns.
