

# **CDC Says Fully Vaccinated Can Drop Masks**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released <u>new COVID-19 guidance</u> on Thursday, saying that individuals who are fully vaccinated can safely resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing (except where otherwise required by local orders or workplace guidance). Wisconsin's Department of Health Services (WDHS) <u>aligned state guidance</u> on Friday.

# WCMA Applauds Evers' Direction of \$100M to Expand Wisconsin Broadband Access

Wisconsin Governor Tony **Evers today announced** that the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) will launch a round of broadband expansion grants on June 1 with \$100 million directed from federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. WCMA has strongly advocated for broadband expansion, both through the use of ARPA aid and via the Wisconsin state budget, and today released <u>this statement</u> applauding Evers' announcement.

According to the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) 2021 Broadband Deployment Report, approximately 394,000 Wisconsinites have no access to broadband, with 98 percent of them living in rural communities.

# WDATCP Announces Processor Grant Winners,

## As WCMA Advocates for More Support

The <u>Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection</u> (WDATCP) today announced the 15 Wisconsin companies that will receive 2021 Dairy Processor Grants, which are designed to foster innovation, improve profitability, and sustain the long-term viability of Wisconsin's dairy processing facilities. Grant winners include WCMA members: Carr Valley Cheese Company, Chalet Cheese Cooperative, Clock Shadow Creamery, Decatur Dairy, Foremost Farms USA, Henning Cheese, K&K Cheese, Maple Leaf Cheese, Nasonville Dairy, Uplands Cheese, Widmer's Cheese, and Zimmerman Cheese.

A total of \$200,000 was available for this year's Dairy Processor Grants, with a maximum \$50,000 allowed for each project. WDATCP received 18 grant requests totaling more than \$630,000. As part of the 2021-2023 biennial budget, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers has proposed increasing the available funding for Dairy Processor Grants by \$600,000 per year to a total of \$800,000 to better support the dairy industry. WCMA is actively advocating for that increased investment.

# **Register Now for WCMA Leadership Courses**

WCMA this week opened registration for its Fall/Winter 2021 leadership trainings, including the popular WCMA Front-Line Leadership Training courses designed for those supervising small teams and the highly rated WCMA Advanced Leadership Series for mid-level managers.

WCMA <u>Front-Line Leadership Training</u> returns with hybrid offerings, allowing students to join classes in person in Madison, Wisconsin or online from anywhere in the world. The courses in this training track can be taken à la carte and in any order.

- Part A, focused on exploring the essential skills to own your role as a supervisor, will be held September 7.
- Part B centers on positively impacting staff performance, and will be held on October 4.
- Part C breaks down the key ingredients for cultivating a team, and will be held on November 8.

Tuition is \$135 and includes materials and instruction, as well as lunch for those attending in person. Enrollment is limited to 22 individuals per class.

The <u>WCMA Advanced Leadership Series</u> will also be offered to students in a hybrid format, allowing them to join in three sessions either in Madison, Wisconsin or online. Those enrolling participate in the entire series as a cohort to better facilitate relationships.

- Session 1 is set for September 16 and will encourage participants to take initiative in driving change and generating positive results for their company.
- Session 2 will be held November 15 and focuses on the application of a creative and collaborative problem-solving process.
- Session 3 wraps the series on January 18, 2022, detailing the tools and strategies leaders can use to foster collaboration and resolve workplace conflict.

This series also features guest speakers from industry detailing their leadership successes and challenges, and requires participants to complete real-world projects that implement their new knowledge. The cost for the entire series, including materials, instruction, and meals, is \$495 per participant. Enrollment is limited to 20 individuals.


