OSHA Submits Rule on Large Employer Vaccines and Testing for White House Approval

In the final step before enactment, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) <u>has submitted</u> an emergency temporary standard (ETS) to the White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB) requiring employers of 100 or more workers to ensure their workforce is vaccinated or regularly tested for COVID-19, as directed by President Biden last month.

Due to the emergency nature of the rule, OMB <u>could approve it</u> within a week's time, allowing OSHA to publish it in the Federal Register. It's not yet clear when new rules would take effect. Once effective, enforcement of the rule could rely on employees reporting concerns to OSHA, rather than inspections or other proactive actions.

FDA Panel Recommends Moderna, Johnson & Johnson Booster Shots

Late last week, an advisory panel of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) <u>unanimously endorsed</u> booster doses of the COVID-19 vaccines manufactured by Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, paving the way for consideration by the full FDA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention <u>as early as this week</u>.

The FDA committee recommended that Americans over age 65 or who work in professions with a high risk of COVID-19 exposure receive a half-dose booster of the Moderna vaccine at least six months from their second shot. The panel also advised that all American adults who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine get a booster at least two months after their first shot.

Wisconsin food and agricultural workers, including dairy processing employees who were fully vaccinated at least six months ago, are <u>already eligible</u> to receive a booster of the Pfizer COVID-19 shot. Pfizer boosters are also available to Wisconsinites over the age of 50 with health conditions such as obesity that put them at a higher risk of severe illness.

Hunger Task Force Seeks Partners for Dairy Donation Program

WCMA members are invited to partner with Hunger Task Force to participate in the federal <u>Dairy Donation Program (DDP)</u>. Under the DDP, dairy farmers, cooperatives, or processors that purchase fresh milk or bulk dairy products to process into retail-packaged dairy products and meet other requirements are eligible to partner with non-profit hunger relief organizations. Together, these partners may apply for reimbursement for some of the cost of milk used to make the donated eligible dairy products, manufacturing of the donated eligible dairy products, and transportation of the donated eligible dairy products.

WCMA Advocates for Ag Export Bill

Alongside WCMA members Chr. Hansen, Inc.; Nasonville Dairy; and Specialty Cheese Company, WCMA staff <u>testified today</u> before a panel of Wisconsin legislators in support of investments to increase the state's agricultural exports, including dairy.

Senate Bill 325/Assembly Bill 314 (SB 325/AB 314), authored by Sen. Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan) and Rep. Tony Kurtz (R-Wonewoc), creates a new five-year initiative to increase the export of Wisconsin's agricultural products by 25 percent. The legislation specifies that \$2.5 million, or half the total funds appropriated, will be used to increase international sales of milk, cheese, yogurt, whey, and other dairy products. Both bills were unanimously approved today by the legislature's Joint Finance Committee.

Public Service Commission of Wisconsin Awards Broadband Access Grants

More than 28,426 residential and 1,490 business locations in 40 Wisconsin counties and three tribal lands have been selected to receive new fiber broadband service in 2022, the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin recently announced. The \$100 million in grants was earmarked by Governor Tony Evers in May 2021 from the state's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding.

WCMA applauds the announcement, as our Policy Committee has actively advocated for broadband funding, both in the state budget and through the use of ARPA monies.

FDA Issues Salt Reduction Guidance

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has issued final guidance providing voluntary, short-term sodium reduction targets for a wide range of foods, including cheese and butter. In addition to modifying other portions of a draft version issued in 2016, the final document sets a milestone date for the goals of 2.5 years from the date of publication.


The meeting agenda will include discussion on the following topics:
