

# Court Maintains Hold on OSHA ETS; Case Expected to Reach Supreme Court

A federal appeals judge this week upheld a stay on the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) for employers of 100 people or more. Multiple legal challenges to the ETS will be consolidated and heard by higher courts. While the outcome and exact timeline of the case is unknown, legal experts believe it is likely to end up before the U.S. Supreme Court. Employment experts recommend businesses proceed with plans to comply with the ETS, in the event it is upheld. WCMA will keep members informed of relevant updates through this e-newsletter and timely alerts.

# WCMA Survey Shows Most Respondents Plan to Offer Vaccine/Testing Option Under OSHA ETS

WCMA thanks the 20 member companies who participated in WCMA's latest *Instant Data* Survey, focused on the industry's implementation plans for the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) new vaccine and testing Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) for employers of 100 or more workers. Twenty companies responded to the survey, representing a combined workforce of more than 33,000 employees.



Regarding vaccination and testing policies, WCMA's survey found:

- 85 percent of respondents will allow employees to choose to be vaccinated against COVID-19 or submit to weekly COVID-19 testing and masking in the workplace.
- 15 percent of employers shared they have not yet decided whether their policy will offer employees the testing alternative.

With respect to weekly COVID-19 testing, WCMA learned:

- 70 percent of respondents have not yet decided how to cover the costs of COVID-19 weekly testing.
- 25 percent of employers have decided to cover all COVID-19 testing costs.
- One company reports they will require employees to cover their own COVID-19 testing costs.

# WCMA Thanks USDA, Baldwin for \$6.13M Investment in DBIA

WCMA last week cheered the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) announcement of \$20.2 million in support for the Dairy Business Innovation Initiative, championed by U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin). The investment includes \$6.13 million for the Dairy Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA), a program administered by WCMA and the Center of Dairy Research (CDR). The DBIA offers direct-to-business grants, free workshops, consultations, and industry research for dairy farmers and processors in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.



### Infrastructure Bill Invests in Rural Communities

President Joe Biden this week signed the \$1.2T Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act into law, paving the way for historic investments in rural communities across the United States. Among other items, the bill provides \$65 billion to help close internet service gaps in rural areas, and \$110 billion for roads, bridges, and other major projects.

# **WCMA Connects Members with Opportunities to**

## **Hire Refugees**

At the direction of WCMA's Workforce and Education Committee, WCMA staff have secured information about how Wisconsin-based member may engage in hiring refugees.

Wisconsin will receive nearly 2,200 refugees in 2022, more than double the total received in 2021. State officials note that 1,300 refugees will arrive from Burma and the Democratic Republic of Congo, while approximately 850 refugees will be resettled here from Afghanistan. Refugees from Burma and Congo are considered permanent residents as they are pre-screened and have full work authorization. They will be received throughout the year, with potentially only a couple of weeks of notice prior to their arrival.

Afghan refugees will have work authorization for at least two years, with additional work authorization to follow with a successful green card application. These people will also receive refugee benefits, meaning they will have aid for food, clothing and housing. They are likely to be permanently resettled beginning in January, and over the following six months.

Currently, seven Wisconsin counties are authorized to accept refugees, because they have designated offices of refugee resettlement. These counties include Brown, Calumet, Dane, Kewaunee, Milwaukee, Oconto, Outagamie, Sheboygan, and Winnebago. Marathon County is likely to be added to this list in early 2022.




