USDA Sec. Vilsack Describes Support for DBIA to Spur Dairy Farm, Processor Innovation



U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack addressed top dairy issues following a tour at a Wisconsin dairy farm on December 16. Vilsack urged producers to sign up for Dairy Margin Coverage and deflected questions about federal milk order reform back on a regionally-divided dairy industry. In a town hall format, WCMA Executive Director John Umhoefer thanked Vilsack for his ongoing support of the Dairy Business Innovation Initiatives program, including the <u>Dairy</u> Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA).

Administered by WCMA and the Center for Dairy Research and funded by USDA, the DBIA offers direct-to-business grants and technical assistance for dairy farmers and processors in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

On February 1, 2022, DBIA will begin accepting applications for its <u>next round of Dairy</u> <u>Business Builder grants</u>, designed to help recipients diversify their business models and become more resilient to market changes.



FDA Nominee Supports Labeling Enforcement

During a <u>Senate confirmation hearing</u> last week, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) commissioner-nominee Dr. Robert Califf noted his support for enforcement of the agency's own labeling standards. In response to questions from U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin), Dr. Califf said there is "almost nothing more fundamental about safety than people understanding exactly what they're ingesting, so I am committed to making this a priority if I am confirmed."

Baldwin is the author of the DAIRY PRIDE Act, which would require the FDA to issue guidance for nationwide enforcement of mislabeled imitation dairy products within 90 days of the bill's passage. WCMA is a strong proponent of the DAIRY PRIDE Act, and advocates for truth-in-food labeling at the federal and state level.

Healthy WI Producer Security Fund May Keep Assessment Holiday in 2022



Dairy processors purchasing milk in Wisconsin enjoyed an "assessment holiday" - that is, no assessments or fees paid into the Wisconsin Agricultural Producer Security Program - in 2021. Continuing robustness in funds for the program indicates a similar holiday is likely in 2022. The program is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.

The advisory council to the producer security program, a group which includes WCMA,

learned December 9 that the pool of funds for the program now holds \$12.5 million, including \$7.7 million for dairy. The program pays dairy producers and grain and vegetable producers a portion of losses in case of a buyer default on payment.

The dairy fund pool grew modestly in the year ending June 30, 2021, gaining \$167,000. Growth slowed due to the assessment holiday. This pause in assessments is triggered when dairy funds exceed \$6 million (and the entire fund holds more than \$11 million). If dairy continues to exceed these trigger levels in March, the assessment holiday will continue throughout 2022. The holiday is offered to milk buyers who have been active in the producer security program for five years or longer.

A <u>complete report on the program</u>, issued annually, notes that 96 organizations purchased milk from dairy farms in Wisconsin in the most recent fiscal year, compared to a peak of 120 organizations in 2014 and 2015. In 2021, the pool of funds benefited when a milk buyer that defaulted in 2019 paid back 100% of the default – \$164,896 – to the producer security program.

Federal Court Lifts Stay on Vaccine-or-Test Mandate; OSHA Extends Compliance Deadlines

On Friday, December 17, a three-judge panel of the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals lifted a stay of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) for employers of 100 or more people.

While the ETS will take effect January 4, OSHA has issued new enforcement deadlines

to ensure employers have sufficient time to come into compliance with the rule. Under OSHA's new guidance, by **January 10, 2022**, employers must determine the vaccination status of each employee and keep related records, provide specific information about vaccines, and develop and implement written vaccination and testing policies. The ETS also allows large employers to permit employees to undergo weekly testing as an alternative to vaccination and, under the new OSHA deadlines, testing must begin on or before **February 9, 2022**.

Multiple plaintiffs have <u>filed emergency applications</u> for an immediate stay of the ETS with the U.S. Supreme Court, and their applications will be reviewed by Justice Brett Kavanaugh, who is assigned to hear petitions from the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals. Justice Kavanaugh could stay the ETS pending review of the entire Court, refer the applications to the full Court for a decision, or take no action pending the full Court's review. WCMA will keep members informed of all relevant developments.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is soliciting bids for <u>butter products</u> for use in federal food assistance programs. Bids are due **January 4** at 9:00 a.m. (CT). Please contact <u>USDA staff</u> with questions.



Apply by January 7 for Wisconsin Dairy Processor Grants

WCMA members operating in Wisconsin can apply now for <u>Dairy Processor Grants</u> of up to \$50,000, available via the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP). Thanks to WCMA's lobbying efforts, the available funding for this program has been doubled to \$400,000 for 2022! Applications are due January 7, with successful applicants to be announced in February.

Eligible applicants must operate a licensed dairy processing plant in Wisconsin that is engaged in pasteurizing, processing, or manufacturing milk or dairy products. Awards can be used to address a wide range of dairy business needs, such as food safety, staff training, plant expansion or modernization, and professional consulting services. Projects must increase capacity or production, and processors are required to provide a match of 20 percent of the grant amount.

This award, named in honor of Championship Cheese Contest Chairman and generous donor Brian Eggebrecht, aims to support students pursuing technical certificates, technical diplomas, or associate degrees that may lead to a career in the dairy industry. Unlike other WCMA scholarships, applicants are not required to be connected to a WCMA member company or cooperative.
